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

Other spots worth visiting to educate the younger generation include Tugu Negara, designed to honour the brave men and women who fought for the country.




3) Charitable works

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4) Have a BBQ

There are at least three ways to go where food is concerned:


Idea #5 above can be incorporated to make it a food hunt instead of a treasure hunt.



With a humble history as a settlement for Orang Asli, the area got its name from Burung Puchong (Herons) which were found in abundance in the area. Puchong has been on a slow but consistent burn from the onset. The growth of the area cannot be denied.

Fishermen, rubber tappers and tin miners occupied the area in different stages of the life of Puchong, and made it what it is today. This focus on raw materials ensured that it eventually got a small 2-lane road in the 1980s. This was the start of the modern-day Puchong we know today.

It's brick-and-mortar industrial past was not the best billboard as an ideal place to make a home, but through the persistence of the local authorities and government, it blossomed from 1985 onwards when the mining license ran out, and it was earmarked for further development. The basic infrastructure from previous industries formed the bare bones in which a bustling community could be built



Beginners' guide to property investing



Investing in properties is a good way of retaining wealth and building a strategy against inflation. But is it the best way to invest your money? It depends on the goal you have. Some prefer assets that possess easy liquidity, like gold. Comparatively, properties are not as liquid as gold. But properties have the ability to make you more if the circumstances are correct.

The first question we have to answer is: Is it a good time to invest in properties? The most accurate answer is yes, it is, especially in 2022. The trend is showing a weaker demand in properties, and this is not helped by the younger generation who seem to prefer to be financially free of supporting a housing loan. It must be stated that highly sought-after properties or areas are still retaining or increasing in value.

We have to narrow this article down to first time investors, and that being the case... this is a great time to invest in properties. This is mainly due to the glut in properties in Malaysia, and the weak economy, it is a buyer's market.



The two very important assumptions we have to establish is:

- 1) You have a stable flow of income, as this is crucial for getting a loan.
- 2) You are looking to invest your RM instead of just putting it in FD or other forms of investments, because you see properties as a tangible asset that may protect your wealth in the short- and long-term.

Next, we also need to establish what your intentions are. Are you planning to hold on to the property over a long period of time, or are you planning to make a quick kill by selling it off at a nominal profit and then moving on to another piece of property?

The one overriding advise we will give is... think long-term and prepare for the worse... if for whatever reason, you are not able to make any money from the property, are you still financially sound? Over stretching your budget or what you can comfortably afford is not advisable as you do not need the extra stress if your Plan A does not work out.

The uncomfortable truth is, with COVID-19 and the Russian-Ukraine war, we are living in very uncertain times. Assume the worse, if there is no rental and no buyers, can you afford to repay the loan and live comfortably. We say this because we do not want to encourage you to invest in a property that you can barely afford to upkeep under the false assumption that ALL property investments have a happy ending.





So again, are you stable enough financially to afford zero income from the property if no one rents or buys it? If you are... continue reading. If you are not... maybe invest in other things first. Do note that in any investments, potential high returns have equally high risk. Therefore, if you cannot stomach the high risk of a potentially higher return, stick to low-risk investments that produces lower returns. Regardless, nothing is certain, as all forms of investments are affected by market and economic conditions, both locally and globally.

But those who think long-term are usually risk-averse and would see the investment as a part of their asset over many years. They are able to wait for the property to increase in value, and then at a desired price, they will sell that property.

Those who are more determined and

impatient, would prefer to flip the property as soon as possible, with even 5% of net profit. They are aiming for a quick conversion so they can increase their wealth ASAP.

For those in the first group, there are multiple options of income such as rental and even an Air BnB model. Rental is ideal for a generally fuss-free return, but it can be likely the least in terms of total amount. Air BnB model offers more returns... as long as you have the demand for your property.

For the second group who plans to buy and then sell off the property very quickly, the fast conversion would likely mean they will have to put in more investment, as desirable locations are more expensive to begin with. If you can spot or predict how a new development will trend, you can buy it at a decent selling price and sell it off at a higher price when the property is then in hot demand.

Another key to the equation is location... location... location. Needless to say, established neighbourhoods will cost more than a new development in a place that is far away from familiar and popular locations.

If it is a new area, an insight into the area and future development helps. For instance, if there are plans to build a university nearby, you can safely assume that 1) parents may want to buy a property nearby for their children who are studying in the University and 2) students will want to rent a place close to their university.

A third group of investors are those who buy a fixer-upper, meaning a potentially abandoned or undesirable property, in which they put in even more money to fix it up to the point where it can be seen as a desirable to potential buyers. If you are in this group, ensure you have the extra money to actually fix it up. Depending on the condition of the property and what you want to do with it, it can cost from RM30,000 to RM300,000.



Accessibility is another key for new developments. Is it accessible? Are there roads linking it to main highways? Are the roads sufficient for the amount of traffic as to prevent jams and bottlenecks? Are there plans for amenities and when will these happen? The longer these are delayed, the less desirable the location is.

But for long-term investors, this is less of an issue, as they are willing to wait and in no hurry to make a profit.

Another way to do this is to look out for developers and developments that have a new scheme designed to attract new buyers. This is a Rent-To-Own model in which potential buyer set themselves in a piece of property with a long-term view of buying it. So, for the first part of the deal, they must commit to renting the place for a period of time, and once that period is over, they have the first-right-of-refusal to purchase said property.

Yet a new way to get involved in property investment is through a real estate investment trust (REIT). It is essentially investing in a company that owns, operates, or finances income-generating real estate. An investor can invest money into this and earn dividends from the property without having the hassle of buying, managing or financing the actual properties.







Remember, property investment is just another type of investment and comes with some amount of risk. There have been some who have bought properties that seem like a good area, but has now been completely abandoned with zero demand for the property or area.

And always make sure you have a stable income to finance your investment. And lastly, there is no such thing as a sure thing, so be prepared for the worse case scenario to avoid a truckload of stress if it goes bad.

If you do plan to make property investing work for you, you will have to stay alerted to what is happening in the market and study the new developments that are proposed to see if they meet your personal criteria for investing in properties.

And finally, be realistic with your investments, because expecting and assuming the best-case scenario is disastrous when it does not happen. Be patient, watchful and stay calm.

Taman Kinding

Located in Perak, the State famous for simple living and good food, Taman Kinding Flora is found in Changkat Kinding, Mukim Hulu Kinta, Perak. Like the State that it sits in, there is an honesty about the development. It is very relatable to people of every walk of life. While modern, it draws inspiration from simpler times – the good old days.




Coffee — vs

VS Tea

which is better?

To start with, coffee and tea are readily consumed all over the world. It is estimated that about 2 billion cups of coffee are consumed daily, while for tea, it is 3.7 billion cups a day.



Clearly, there are personal preferences as some swear by coffee and others swear by tea, but is one better than the other? Both are known to contain caffeine and antioxidants, and these two elements are scientifically proven to be beneficial to us.

After decades of research, what is clear is that both drinks are beneficial to most people. We say "most people" because there is a very small percentage of the world's population that are very sensitive or even allergic to either coffee or tea, mainly due to the caffeine found in both drinks. Some of these adverse reactions for caffeine sensitivity are fast heartbeat, headache, jitters, nervousness or anxiousness, restlessness and insomnia. For those who are allergic, the symptoms are much more severe and includes itchy skin, hives, swelling of the throat or tongue and even difficulty in breathing.

If you are sensitive or allergic to caffeine, it is best to avoid both beverages.

For the majority of us who are not sensitive or allergic to either coffee or tea, the good news is... both beverages are potentially good for you. "Potentially" because research have yet to confirm that they provide the same conclusive benefits to everyone in the exact same way. This simply means that coffee or tea will be more beneficial to some people and less beneficial to others.

How much caffeine? Coffee Tea 95 mg 47 mg

An average cup of coffee contains 95mg of caffeine, while an average cup of tea contains 47mg. Understand that there are many different types of coffee and tea, so these average figures are just an estimate, as your favourite coffee or tea may have more... or less... caffeine than the average number stated above.

Coffee and tea differs in many ways, one of which is the way they boost your energy or how they perk you up. Coffee delivers a almost immediate boost while tea provides a gradual and slower boost.

Tea has the advantage of providing calmness and relaxing the drinker due to other elements in tea that are not found in coffee. So, if you feel stressed, avoid coffee and go with tea.



The best tasting coffee or tea, like those found in coffeeor tea-based franchises may not be the healthiest either. In general, research have shown that coffee that is freshly ground from a bean contains the most benefits, while instant/powdered coffee is not as beneficial. The same can be said for tea, drinking tea from whole tea leaves are more beneficial than those found in packed tea bags. Like most food we take, the fresher and least processed types are the ones that are most beneficial to our health. Due to our personal physiology and DNA, some can take only one cup of coffee or tea a day, while others can consume more than 10 cups of either with no adverse side effects. But it is commonly accepted that one to two cups of coffee and two to four cups of tea are safe for a normal and healthy person. We recommend a moderate approach to drinking these two beverages, especially coffee. Coffee is also known to be potentially addictive, and has been labelled the most freely available addictive drug in the world. So, beware and do not over-consume coffee.

Ultimately, research has linked coffee and tea to many (potential) health benefits. While coffee and tea have similar health benefits, some research suggest that coffee can prevent Type 2 diabetes, boost physical performance, and provide essential nutrients such as B vitamins, manganese and potassium. Tea on the other hand may prevent cancer, help with weight management, boost brain health and prevents heart disease.

In general caffeine is noted to improve physical performance (by up to 12%), boost mood and mental alertness, quicken reaction time, improves memory and brain processing capabilities, decrease risk of Type 2 diabetes, gives added benefits of protection against dementia and Alzheimer's disease, gives added protection against cancers and heart diseases by lowering strokes.

Studies have also shown that people who drink four cups of black tea or more per day reduces their risk of stroke by 21 percent when compared to non-drinkers. Studies have similarly shown that five cups or more of coffee per day reduces stroke by 23 percent. If you have trouble sleeping, avoid coffee and go with mild tea like camomile. The same can be said for people who are living a stressful life and high anxiety.





Is one drink better than the other? The right answer is, a good cup of coffee or tea is the perfect beverage, depending on the individual and their needs. If you are a healthy individual, you can drink both. Maybe coffee in the morning, noon and afternoon, and tea in the evening.

Drink whatever works for you, as everyone is different. And instead of buying from popular franchises, why not make your own brew at home, as you have better control of the ingredients? Definitely consider less or zero sugar, and maybe try some non-dairy milk such as milk from nuts or grains.

Remember, whatever you choose to drink, drink in moderation.
